

CLEANING GUIDE FOR CENTURION®

WIPE, WASH & RINSE IS ALL YOU DO TO CLEAN CENTURION®.

MAINTENANCE:

Regular maintenance is recommended as CENTURION is a textile and like all other fabrics, it must be regularly cared for to maintain its original features. Quickly take care of spills when they occur, and in high use areas be sure to clean the seating once every 3 – 4 months to avoid the build up of dirt.

Tests were done using liquid detergents, foam upholstery cleaners, solvent cleaners and also powdered enzyme detergent. The results showed that using the powdered enzyme detergent provided the most effective cleaning results. Therefore to be totally safe, **we DO NOT recommend the use of any solvent cleaners.**

For best cleaning results, use a powdered enzyme detergent mixed with water (e.g. Drive Power Concentrate or similar). Clean the upholstery with a soft brush or towel with the soap solution. It is important that you remove all soap with clear water.

SPILLS:

Cleaning results would be better and easier, the quicker you take care of any problems. As explained above, generally stains are quickly removed with plain water and powdered household enzyme detergent. Be sure to follow 3 simple steps: wipe, wash and rinse. In some stubborn cases, you may wish to make a paste like mixture of an enzyme detergent with water, using a brush to remove the stain and ensuring removal of all soap residue.

INK, MARKERS, CRAYON:

Use strong water based cleaner. Beware that some ink pens cause permanent stains.

GREASE, TAR, CHEWING GUM:

Harden with ice then carefully remove hardened substance with light scraper and follow the above cleaning method.

N.B.

When fabric is stained with hard stains like blood, coffee, cigarette ash, black rubber etc. attention should be taken immediately, by using the above method.

Failing to do so, the stain will get embedded and then become difficult to remove. Should the stain not be cleaned for days and weeks then it is practically impossible to remove.
